It's Either/Or! Or is it both/and?!

People have been noticing and bemoaning that America has become polarized. "If you are not with me, you are my enemy." So, everything becomes either/or.

Back when I began pastoring in southwestern Minnesota, it was whether you drove green John Deere tractors or red Case tractors. When I moved to northwestern Wisconsin, it was whether you were a Vikings fan or a Packers fan. It was either one or the other, the lines were clearly drawn.

Since then, this either/or attitude seems to have taken over everything, especially politics, theology, and even congregational life. "If you are not with me, you are my enemy."

Amid all this, Martin Luther said the Christian life is lived both/and. For example, we are simultaneously saints and sinners. That is, in Christ, we are 100% saint already! And, in this life, we are at the same time still 100% sinner. We don't increase the saintly percentage over our life, nor do we decrease the sinnerly percentage. We are 100% saint and 100% sinner!

Or, of course, there is our emphasis on Law and Gospel. In this life, we need both. We have not outgrown the Law. At the same time, the Gospel calls us forward into freedom to loving service. As Luther said, to be a Christian is to be "the most free lord of all, subject to none; and the most dutiful servant of all, subject to everyone." As Americans, we tend to insist on our freedoms, and yet, as Christians we are free, freed to serve our neighbor in love.

When we want to solve societal issues, we are prone to focus on increased regulation or we say the real, underlying issue is Sin and that is repaired only by the Gospel, and so we poo-poo the folly of regulation. Of course, our response to societal ills is both/and, both Law and Gospel.

So, while this world most decidedly is either/or, we the church are freed and called to live in this world as a both/and culture! Yes, this is hard, as our human way is bound to be either/or, yet God's way is both/and.

Years ago, I took an improvisation workshop at the famed Dudley Riggs' Brave New Workshop. The number one rule of improv is always saying/doing "yes, and!" That is, when our acting partner offers up a theme or dialog, our gut reaction is we want to do what we want to do, and so we will respond, "no, but." If, however, we can collaborate with our acting partners and say, "yes and...," if we can take what they offer, and add to it, oh the places you'll go! It's like how the psalms are written: the first half of each verse (what the lector says) makes a statement, the second half (what the congregation says), takes what the first half says and adds to it, amplifies it.

Try it! Next time your immediate reaction in some polarized discussion is to say, "no, but," try saying, "yes, and." See where the Spirit takes you.

Jesus loves you, and so do I.
