Nursing Notes

By now you probably have read in the paper or saw on TV news that loneliness has risen to a crisis level in the US. Loneliness has been a concern for seniors but now youth and young adults have risen to the top of the numbers aside of seniors.

Researchers have outlined some possible causes including the strong online presence of the young. Connecting with friends and family is now primarily via texting. Even email has fallen off. Many people are holed up in their homes and apartments all day and night as post Covid telecommuting work continues. Psychiatrists and Phycologists are concerned what role this isolation will play long term and if loneliness may not be the only effect. Research will show that people seek out others for fuller and more fulfilling lives.

So we may recognize the need for change but what can we do for next steps? This is a hard question. People need to be open to change and to be open to try several things which might be hard and takes a conscientious effort.

Simple starting points might include

1. Set one day or evening every other week to go out into people populated places.

2. Make a plan to meet with someone to talk, have a meal, see an event...the Holidays have dozen of choices.

3. Call someone you have not called, seen or missed.

These are just a few simple starts but you have to make the effort, don't put off a planned effort.

A couple of the articles suggested writing right on your calendar your planned actions so you can't easily overlook or forget to do them.

I myself have been trying to be timely rather than letting it get to late to call friend or family. I try to remember a quote I heard, "You cannot complain of being lonely if you haven't reached out to someone else who may also to be lonely".

Many people donated items to fill the boxes; toys, balls, jump ropes, yoyos, small flashlights, school supplies, art and craft kits, plush animals, washcloths, toothbrushes, combs, hair supplies. Thank you to those who donated items and/or gave money for postage for the boxes. Thank you also for the treats and drinks folks donated for the volunteers who filled boxes.

A total of 83 boxes were filled this year. This is a new record!!!!

A big thank you to Cherill and Kathy who organized the whole event; from collecting and sorting donations, setting up the items on tables and packing up what was left for next year! They accept donations all year round so please contact them. There is a special closet at church where items can be stored.

Mary brings the filled boxes to a central location in the metro area where they will be processed and moved on their way to their destinations. Once they reach their destination, missions and churches hand them out along with a twelve week Bible study workbook. When the child completes the study, they receive a Bible in their home language.
