

We have received our permit for the conversion of the Common Grounds into an infant / toddler wing, and will begin setting up the work site and temporary infant feeding station in the hallway on Wednesday / Thursday. We are so excited to get started!

I am also very happy to announce that we have received a grant for playground improvements through First Child's Finance in the amount of \$11,700. This grant is earmarked for the repair of the broken fence of our preschool playground, and includes a mulch refill, as well as an increase in the railroad tie barrier to prevent mulch from spilling. Now the trick will be to get on our contractor's packed schedule! Fall will be busy!

A big thank you to Lisa Borneman and Deb Smith for the sorting and organizing of the theater props in the basement, and working with College Hunks to get a full truck load of superfluous items out of our storage! In addition, Randy has already taken care of many items under the theater stage in the Fellowship Hall, and thanks to those combined efforts, we now have easy temporary storage space during construction, and an orderly and fire code compliant theater storage in the basement!
