From the Parish Nurse **By Robbi Moore Nursing Notes**



First I want to do a brief review of the last few months of Dementia and Alzheimers. Remember that these are very complex diagnoses that take experienced care professionals to sort out and even then some diagnoses are elusive and may take years to solve if at all. One easy to misdiagnose is the family's report on what seems to be a clear cut dementia case. Because patients have no signs of reference, the family does not seem to think an appointment is in order. Mom is just getting super forgetful...but is she? No, there has been no bladder symptoms either, what else can it be? An alarming number of UTI s have a late diagnosis because family assumed it was dementia.

If anything is different, don't second guess yourself - get an appt. Sometimes it can be a change in routine, a move from a familiar locale, or a death (and it does not have to be a close family member). Grief can easily be mistaken for a mental health change. Families need to be detectives as you know your loved one best. Take time to do your own grieving. I still recall my very dear second mom announcing that now in her 80s and several joint replacements later she was mourning her beloved roller skating. Her doctor questioned her daughter convinced she had lost reality. They did not know her.

This is why we need to be good reporters. Hopefully I have helped a little in separating all these various, but from a distance, seeming diagnoses.

If you had a National Nite Out neighborhood directory just dig it out and place by phone and get the school main number and write it on it. Or call police if you can not rouse anyone at school. You do not need to engage child but can make a big difference in their safety.
