News from VEAP.



Food and supplies are always appreciated at VEAP. If you are looking for other ways to support VEAP listed below are several ideas.

Street Kits: VEAP's Social Services team supports people in our community experiencing homelessness with to-go packs. These kits generally include a backpack filled with warm weather gear and personal hygiene items.

Birthday Bags: For families with little ones celebrating their special day. VEAP offers birthday bag kits. These kits generally include cake/cupcake mix, frosting, candles, plates/napkins, and assorted party favors. Assembling birthday bags is a great activity for young people!

Hygiene Kits: We all use it! Support VEAP's visitors by collecting and repackaging toilet paper. Alternatively, you can assist our youngest visitors by donating and repackaging diapers (all sizes needed, but particularly sizes 3 and up) and formula. We also encourage menstruation product kits (tampons, pads).

Express Packs: We distribute 35-40 express packs of shelf-stable items at our pantry every day! Support our team in donating, organizing, and assembling non-perishable food items for these important kits. Children's Books: VEAP distributes around 200 books a week to babies, kids,

and teens visiting our pantry. Support young people by donating gently used or new books to us! We're specifically seeking materials in Spanish. Please, no religious content.









