As we Gather...

Today in worship we hear the penultimate story of the summer series of "God's Greatest Hits" with "Job: Out of the Whirlwind." The book tells the hard tale of a righteous person encountering extreme tragedy, and the discussion which unfolds between Job and his friends regarding the suffering. God finally responds from a whirlwind, and in one way or another Job finds courage and freedom to carry on. How may it give us wisdom and insight to our own life and the creation even now?

Amid all the world's suffering, including our own, surround us with the whirlwind of your love and compassion, and help us to share it, in Jesus' name. Amen.

FIRST READING: Job 1:1-5, 13-22

(The ancient story of Job confronts deep theological questions, especially questions of the existence of human suffering and God's relationship to creation.)

There was once a man in the land of Uz whose name was Job. That man was blameless and upright, one who feared God and turned away from evil. ² There were born to him seven sons and three daughters. ³ He had seven thousand sheep, three thousand camels, five hundred yoke of oxen, five hundred donkeys, and very many servants, so that this man was the greatest of all the people of the East. ⁴ His sons used to go and hold feasts in one another's houses in turn, and they would send and invite their three sisters to eat and drink with them. ⁵ And when the feast days had run their course, Job would send and sanctify them, and he would rise early in the morning and offer burnt offerings according to the number of them all, for Job said, "It may be that my children have sinned and cursed God in their hearts." This is what Job always did.

¹³ One day when his sons and daughters were eating and drinking wine in the eldest brother's house, ¹⁴ a messenger came to Job and said, "The oxen were plowing and the donkeys were feeding beside them, ¹⁵ and the Sabeans fell on them and carried them off and killed the servants with the edge of the sword; I alone have escaped to tell you." ¹⁶ While he was still speaking, another came and said, "The fire of God fell from heaven and burned up the sheep and the servants and consumed them; I alone have escaped to tell you." ¹⁷ While he was still speaking, another came and said, "The Chaldeans formed three columns, made a raid on the camels and carried them off, and killed the servants with the edge of the sword; I alone have escaped to tell you." ¹⁸ While he was still speaking, another came and said, "Your sons and daughters were eating and drinking wine in their eldest brother's house, ¹⁹ and suddenly a great

wind came across the desert, struck the four corners of the house, and it fell on the young people, and they are dead; I alone have escaped to tell you."

²⁰ Then Job arose, tore his robe, shaved his head, and fell on the ground and worshiped. ²¹ He said, "Naked I came from my mother's womb, and naked shall I return there; the LORD gave, and the LORD has taken away; blessed be the name of the LORD."

²² In all this Job did not sin or charge God with wrongdoing.

Word of God, word of life. **Thanks be to God.**

PSALM 130:1-6 (read responsively)

¹Out of the depths I cry to you, O LORD.

- Lord, hear my voice!Let your ears be attentiveto the voice of my supplications!
- ³ If you, O LORD, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand?
- ⁴ But there is forgiveness with you, so that you may be revered.
- ⁵ I wait for the LORD; my soul waits, and in his word I hope;
- ⁶ my soul waits for the Lord more than those who watch for the morning, more than those who watch for the morning.

SECOND READING: Job 2:1-13

(God's wager with the "Accuser" advances, as does Job's suffering.)

¹One day the heavenly beings came to present themselves before the LORD, and the accuser also came among them to present himself before the LORD. ² The LORD said to the accuser, "Where have you come from?" The accuser answered the LORD, "From going to and fro on the earth and from walking up and down on it." ³ The LORD said to the accuser, "Have you considered my servant Job? There is no one like him on the earth, a blameless and upright man who fears God and turns away from evil. He still persists in his integrity, although you incited me against him, to destroy him for no reason." ⁴ Then the accuser answered the LORD, "Skin for skin! All that the man has he will give for his life. ⁵ But stretch out your hand now and touch his bone and his flesh, and he will curse you to your face." ⁶ The LORD said to the accuser, "Very well, he is in your power; only spare his life."

⁷ So the accuser went out from the presence of the LORD and inflicted loathsome sores on Job from the sole of his foot to the crown of his head. ⁸ Job took a potsherd with which to scrape himself and sat among the ashes.

⁹ Then his wife said to him, "Do you still persist in your integrity? Curse God and die." ¹⁰ But he said to her, "You speak as any foolish woman would speak. Shall we receive good from God and not receive evil?" In all this Job did not sin with his lips.

¹¹ Now when Job's three friends heard of all these troubles that had come upon him, each of them set out from his home—Eliphaz the Temanite, Bildad the Shuhite, and Zophar the Naamathite. They met together to go and console and comfort him. ¹² When they saw him from a distance, they did not recognize him, and they raised their voices and wept aloud; they tore their robes and threw dust in the air upon their heads. ¹³ They sat with him on the ground seven days and seven nights, and no one spoke a word to him, for they saw that his suffering was very great.

Word of God, word of life.
