Last month we had the privilege of hosting a funeral for a beloved member of the Mundo de Paz congregation. "Chana," as she was known, was regarded as the matriarch and grandmother of the community. I was surprised to learn from Pastor Tito that it was the

first funeral he has officiated in these many years leading the congregation. He also shared the verse above as his grounding scripture in remembering and honoring Chana and God's grace in her life and death. "The path of the righteous is like the light of dawn, which shines brighter and brighter until full day." He told me how the light of Christ in Chana had indeed grown and shown brighter and brighter and spread to so many others. What a testament to her faith and God's love. May her memory be a blessing.

It comes to mind as we encounter a bit more darkness these days. I note that on average, November is the cloudiest month in Minnesota, and by the end we will encounter some of the earliest sunsets of the entire year. Times remain somewhat dark, too, as we are mindful of much hatred, abuse, corruption, injustice, violence, and cruelty carried in many hearts, not least of which by some of the most powerful in leadership. Like many of you have shared, I find it daunting, worrisome, and a bit overwhelming at times.

But the verse above continues to ground me in who we are and to what we are called as followers of Jesus. **We are about light!** And light has great power to spread! We are about love, peace, hope, and joy. We are about care and compassion and mercy and protection for those in need. **We are about shining light in dark places and dark times.**

Cherill and Kathy Lindquist hosted the event and Mary Katuza, the OCC rep was there to assist. The filled boxes are sent all over the world to spread the word of God and give joy to children.

Many people donated items to fill the boxes; toys, balls, jump ropes, yoyos, small flashlights, school supplies, art and craft kits, plush animals, washcloths, toothbrushes, combs, hair supplies. Thank you to those who donated items and/or gave money for postage for the boxes. Thank you also for the treats and drinks folks donated for the volunteers who filled boxes.

#### A total of 100 boxes were filled this year. This is a new record!!!!

A big thank you to Cherill and Kathy who organized the whole event; from collecting and sorting donations, setting up the items on tables and packing up what was left for next year! They accept donations all year round so please contact them. There is a special closet at church where items can be stored.

Mary brings the filled boxes to a central location in the metro area where they will be processed and moved on their way to their destinations. Once they reach their destination, missions and churches hand them out along with a twelve week Bible study workbook. When the child completes the study, they receive a Bible in their home language. It has been such a blessing for many years having the connection with Richfield Lutheran with their packing party for Operation Christmas Child.
